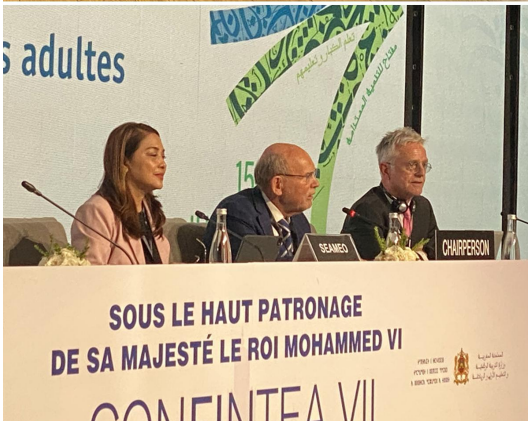
This newsletter can tell you all about learning opportunities you can benefit from. It showcases events, projects, and programmes that may enhance your education, science, and culture know-how and skills.

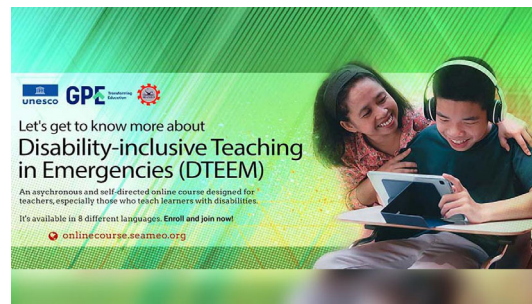
SEAMES Director met with Minister of Education of Morocco in CONFINTEA VII

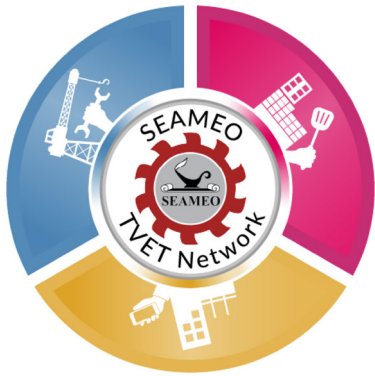
SEA-PLM was Featured in an APREMC-II Side Event

In line with the new normal, SEAMEO launched the TVET Virtual Exchange Platform. Registration for the 2022 SEAMEO TVET Exchange Program began in

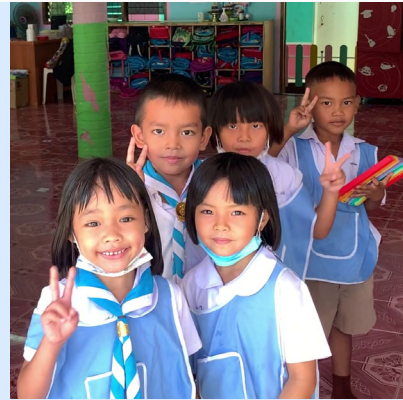


May and remains ongoing. To date, more than 70 institutions and over 800 students and teachers have joined.
